Mission Moments

As we come to the close of summer 2025, I often find Fall to be a time of reflection and renewal. This time of year is a call to reflect on life's blessings, to be patient in our journey with Christ, and to appreciate the beauty in seasonal changes.

The theme of renewal is a continual process for the believer. As believers are still prone to sin, it is important for renewal to become a constant practice as we seek to live lives that reflect Christ.

Reflection and renewal for mission purposes here at Logan this September will mean concentrating on our two ongoing missions that we participate in all year long. Namely, collecting **nonperishable** food items for our Logan Emergency Food Shelf and collecting aluminum tabs for the Ronald McDonald House in Camden, NJ. Both of these missions provide hope for the hopeless in a world that often leaves many feeling like they have nowhere to turn for help.

All items listed in red represent the most requested food items from the visitors to the Logan Emergency Food Shelf. Examples are typed in black. All sizes are acceptable unless otherwise noted.

Boxes of Cereal	Granola Bars	Snacks: potato chips, pretzels, goldfish, crackers, etc.	Handi-Snacks: individually wrapped packages of cheese and crackers; peanut butter and crackers; breadsticks with cheese

RONALD MCDONALD ALUMINUM TABS:

Yet another example of renewal is Logan's ongoing collection of aluminum tabs supporting the Ronald McDonald House of Southern New Jersey. Remember, aluminum tabs can be more than just soda pop tabs. They can come from any aluminum can, such as energy drinks, vegetables, soup, etc.

By collecting aluminum tabs, the Ronald McDonald House can recycle them to raise money for their operations, including providing support and care for families of children receiving medical treatment. The funds from the recycling program go toward essential services, helping them to keep their doors open and serve families regardless of their ability to pay.
