WORTH REMEMBERING

In the hallway of the basement is a closet where we keep the few historical artifacts that we have from our congregation, an odd assortment of scrapbooks, photographs, and papers collected over the past 129 years.

The cabinet, at one time, was not particularly well organized. Photographs from the 1890s lay next to a newspaper clipping from the 1950s and a worship bulletin from the early '90s. True historians would not be happy at the way the papers were stored, and the casual way we rifled through them looking for information about our past.

Now that the archives are a bit more organized it's easier to find long-forgotten details worth revisiting for the upcoming centenary of Logan's sanctuary. For instance, the 1000 people who attend Logan's ground breaking ceremony, or the order of service dedicating the sanctuary, and of course the donations and mortgage needed to start the building project.

There are only a few pictures of the FLC that served as the original church building from the 1890s and the people who attended; but still, it was enough to help imagine people dressed in their Sunday best stepping up the front steps and into that sanctuary for worship.

I looked through old scrapbooks and commemorative programs from past anniversaries. I read newsletter articles and old bulletins. I even skimmed through those Session meeting minutes from the early years. They were not as interesting as I

had hoped—I guess I was looking for a little church drama, but whoever that secretary was in 1925 didn't spill the beans.

Gathering in the Logan sanctuary is something special. Every time we enter it, we remember that this is where our children were baptized or married, where our spouses were given back to God at funerals, and where we come Sunday after Sunday in search of a word from God. When I needed a quiet place to pray during the week, I would sit in the empty sanctuary, wanting to be in the place where so many had prayed before me.

I know we sometimes take our relationship with our church buildings for granted. We love having our particular place to worship and engage in all of the activities of being a family of faith, and we cherish the sacred memories created there. But we also feel like passing out when we see how much it costs for the upkeep.

God certainly doesn't need a cherished old building to be close to us. As the psalmists repeatedly remind us, "all the earth belongs to the Lord." We can feel him just as much on a long walk in the wilderness, or even a crowded, smelly platform of a subway station. But to make sense of those encounters we gather with others in Logan Memorial "to gaze on the beauty of the Lord and to seek him in his temple," which the psalmist David calls his greatest desire in Psalm 27:4.

December 13th, 1925, the date of our sanctuary's dedication, is worth remembering. As we approach Christmas, we can take an opportunity to pause and give thanks for 100 years of community, memories, and worship in Logan's beautiful sanctuary. But, most importantly, this is a time to give thanks for the love, hope and joy found in Jesus – our Saviour and friend. As we exchange gifts with loved ones, it is out of remembrance of the gift God gave us in Jesus. The gift that we are loved, are never alone and can have hope for the future.
